

Why Complete a Comprehensive Recreation and Open Space Plan?




What are the most important components of a comprehensive park, recreation and open space plan?









Official Map, 2009





Public Meeting 1

"Permanently protect areas of open space for passive recreation, habitat protection and enhancement of community character"

- What are the types of future open space lands that are the most important for the Township to consider? What is the criteria for evaluation? How do we balance growth with OS protection?
- What is the impact of protected open space on adjacent land owners?
- Are there opportunities for public/private partnerships that can provide open space still developing community?
- What kind of tools should be used to preserve open space (acquisition, easements, Official Map, dedicated fund)?


