RESOLUTIONS

Resolution No. 2023-08 – Amending Police Pension Plan

Resolution No. 2023-09 - Authorizing Submission of Grant Application

Motion made by Mr. Benner and seconded by Mr. Inglis to adopt Resolution No. 2023-09 authorizing the submission of a grant application to the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for the purpose of obtaining funding to assist with construction of the Saucon Rail Trail Pedestrian Bridge over Preston Lane.

Award Bid for 2023 Detention Basin Mowing Project

Motion made by Mr. Spaeth and seconded by Mr. Wagner to award the bid for the 2023 Detention Basin-Mowing Project to Sottosanti Lawn Care for a total bid price of \$65,448.00.

Supervisor Spaeth suggested exploring the possibility of converting some of the Township's traditional detention basins to naturalized basins that only require mowing once or twice a year.
