#### CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Farrell called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m., in the Public Meeting Room of the Upper Saucon Township Municipal Building, 5500 Camp-Meeting Road, Upper Saucon Township, Lehigh County, PA.

# <u>PUBLIC HEARING ON STACK-CENTER VALLEY & OLD BETH PIKE, LLC - APPLICATION FOR CONDITIONAL USE APPROVAL</u>

The application of Stack-Center Valley & Old Beth Pike, LLC to construct a self-storage facility and related site improvements on approximately 4.55 acres of land located at 5928 Old Bethlehem Pike. The site is located in the Commercial Zoning District with Lehigh

County parcel identification number: 642435296286-1. The applicant requests Conditional Use approval pursuant to Zoning Ordinance Sections 462, relating to Mini-Warehouses, and 905, relating to Conditional Uses.

Chairman Farrell opened the hearing and asked Solicitor Dinkelacker to handle the proceedings.

Solicitor Dinkelacker explained the purpose of the hearing and provided background information on the Conditional Use Application submitted by Stack-Center Valley & Old Beth Pike, LLC.

Solicitor Dinkelacker noted Exhibits T-1 through T-8 will become part of the official record of the hearing.

Attorney Chris McLean of Fitzpatrick, Lentz & Bubba was present on behalf of the Applicant, Stack-Center Valley & Old Beth Pike, LLC. He provided a brief overview of the proposed self-storage facility. He said evidence and testimony would be presented that shows the project fully complies with the Township's Conditional Use criteria.

Nache Nielson of Stack Storage provided testimony in support of the Applicant's request for Conditional Use approval. He described the general layout of the facility and its operations. He said he worked extensively with the Township relative to the architecture for the facility.

Michael Schwartz, a civil engineer with Gilmore and Associates, testified on behalf of the Applicant. He described his education, professional experience and qualifications. He said his office prepared the site plan for the proposed facility. He provided a general overview of the project. He testified the project complies with the Conditional Use criteria contained in the Zoning Ordinance. He said the self-storage facility would produce far less traffic than some of the other uses that could be built there. He briefly reviewed the landscaping for the project. He said the facility would fit in with the character of the neighborhood and adjacent properties would be safeguarded. He said the project would be served by public water and public sewer, and there would be no impact on the School District. He testified sidewalks would be constructed along Old Bethlehem Pike and there would be no development in the floodplain.

Attorney McLean asked that Exhibits A-1 through A-8 be admitted into evidence. The Exhibits were admitted without objection.

Solicitor Dinkelacker asked if anyone from the public wished to comment on the Conditional Use Application. There was no response.

Chairman Farrell closed the public hearing.

Board Action on Conditional Use Application of Stack-Center Valley & Old Beth Pike, LLC Motion made by Mr. Benner and seconded by Mr. Inglis to conditionally approve the Conditional Use Application of Stack-Center Valley & Old Beth Pike, LLC and to direct the Township Solicitor to draft an order and decision consistent therewith. The specific conditions of approval being: 1) Satisfaction of all conditions of land development plan approval; 2) Recordation of the Land Development Plan in accordance with the requirements of the Municipalities Planning Code; and 3) A determination of the Township as to the need to restrict turn movements by trucks from the proposed facility onto Old Bethlehem Pike.

The motion was approved by a vote of 5 to 0.
